Tyler,

Thank you for your consideration. Based on the process when the City of Boise changed its franchise tax rate (which was later reversed), it took the Commission just over 4 months from our filing date to receiving the Commission's decision and approval.

I don't recall how much advance notice we received from the City about the rate change or how long it took us to file, but our implementation was delayed because we did not receive Commission approval until a month after the city's effective date. We filed a Tariff Advice with the Commission in August, it was approved in November, but the effective date of the City's rate change was October 1. So at least 5 months from start to finish for the process would be best.
