



St. Maries Woodstove Change Out Program

Homeowner Application Information Sheet 2023

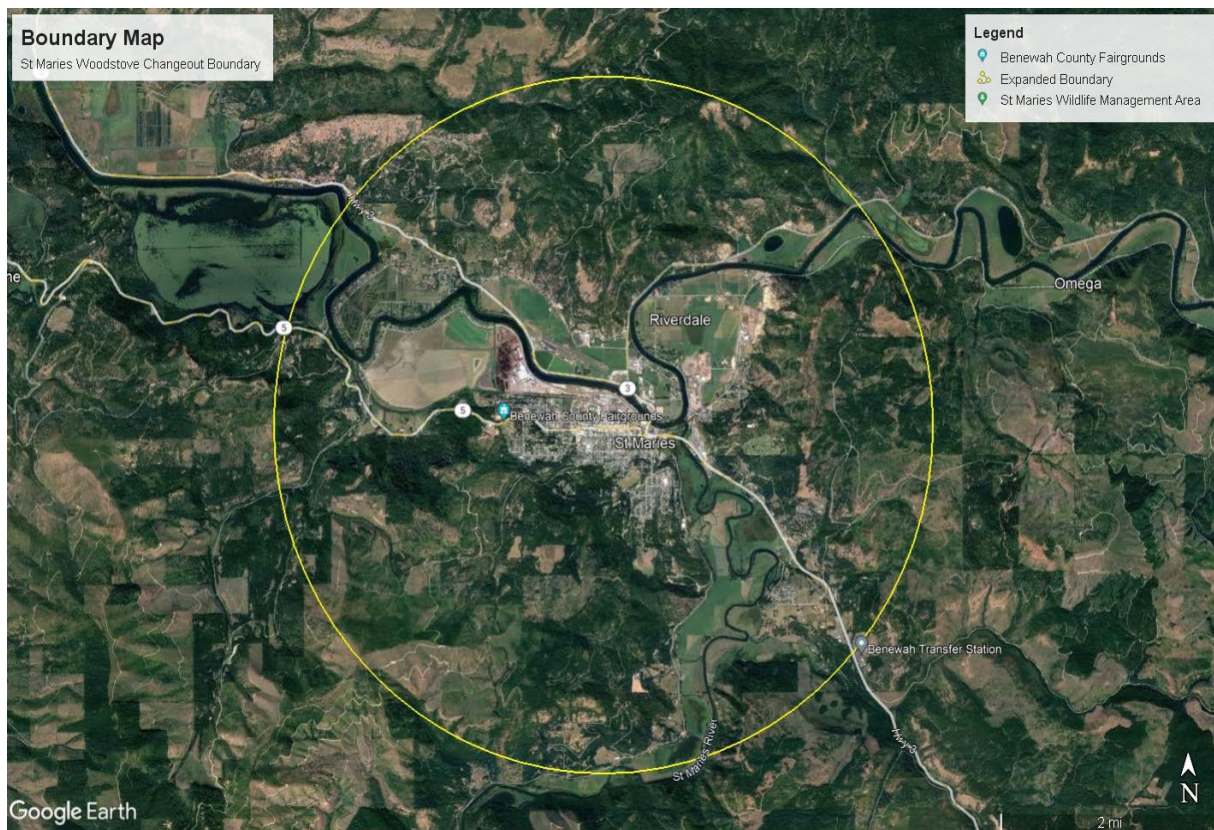


Figure 1. St. Maries Woodstove Changeout Program.

The St. Maries Woodstove Changeout Program is offering rebates of up to \$6,500 for woodstove changeouts in the St. Maries area (Figure 1). Wood stoves that are not US Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) certified or are more than 20 years old will be replaced with new EPA-certified freestanding woodstoves and inserts; new EPA-certified wood pellet freestanding stoves and inserts; propane and natural gas or electrical heat pump heating appliances.”.

To qualify for the program, the homeowner must complete the homeowner application. Only homeowners are eligible for rebates. If the residence is a rental, the homeowner must also submit a completed and signed Homeowner/Tenant Agreement to participate in the changeout program.

Applications will be accepted for this phase of the program from November 1 through December 31, 2023. Only households within the program boundaries (Figure 1) will be considered for a changeout.

St. Maries Woodstove Change Out Program

Homeowners must provide photos of their existing heating appliance **before** removal as part of their completed application. Photos must show the following:

- Front view of existing wood stove (insert and freestanding) **Mandatory.**
- Current EPA certification tag (if present)
- Name plate (model) (if present)

If it is difficult to access the back of a woodstove or pellet insert to get photos and determine the EPA certification, manufacture date, and name plate (model), contact DEQ for assistance.

Completed applications must be signed by the homeowner and emailed or mailed to DEQ’s Coeur d’Alene Regional Office at the address listed on the application form.

First priority will be given to verified low-income households. Verified low-income households will be eligible for up to, but not exceed, \$6,500. Other applicants may qualify for up to, but not exceed, \$4,000. Funding is limited and **not** guaranteed.

Homeowners may qualify for a low-income rebate if they have a verified household income below 200% of the US Department of Health and Human Services Poverty Guidelines.

Homeowners who apply and are approved to receive a rebate for a new qualifying heating appliance through this program will choose a participating vendor from DEQ’s approved Participating Vendor List. No self-installations are allowed under this program. Homeowners work directly with a participating vendor to remove their existing wood stove and install the new qualifying heating appliance. After installation, DEQ will reimburse the participating vendor for each issued rebate. Any cost above the agreed upon estimate will be the responsibility of the Homeowner at the time of installation.
